National PTA Guidance on Outside Organizations


From time to time, local PTA units may be asked to sponsor, charter, and enter into agreements with



other nonprofits, community organizations or school-based entities. These requests usually occur because another organization is looking for an umbrella or partner organization with which they can receive benefits they cannot access on their own. The benefits they wish

to access could include the PTA's (or its individual members') financial resources, community reputation, access to space, communication channels, and other advantages that a formal or informal partnership could bring to the table. Sometimes these agreements create windows of opportunity for a local PTA, but each agreement decision should be carefully made after the PTA has done its due diligence in answering these questions.

leaders, activists, artists, inventors, and beyond.


By celebrating Black History Month, we not only honor the past, but also recognize the importance of diversity, equity, and inclusion in shaping a more just and equitable future for all.

Application Requirements

- Be a citizen or resident alien of the United States of America with a valid Social Security number or Tax ID Number (TIN)
- · Be enrolled in school, or homeschooled, in New Mexico
- . Be in grades K-8 at the time of application
- · Prepare a short personal statement
- Provide official documentation from current school or source of education
- · Demonstrate financial need
- · Agree with Terms & Conditions of the award
